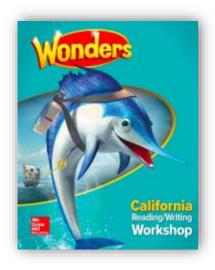
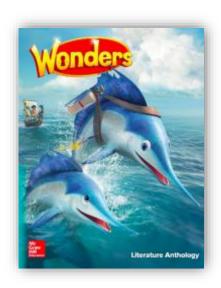
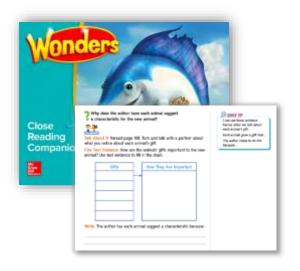
## 3 Core Components of Wonders







## Reading Writing Workshop

- Models and guides practice, close reading, accessing complex text, finding text evidence, collaborative conversations, and writing
- Mini-lessons for skills and strategies in support of the standards
- Contains the first text in the instructional pathway each week

## Literature Anthology

- Students practice & apply the skills modeled in the RWW
- Includes an anchor text and a paired text, allowing for integration of knowledge and ideas
- Works in conjunction with the Close Reading Companion

## **Close Reading Companion**

- Includes text dependent questions & annotation practice linked to the text in the Literature Anthology
  - o 3 questions from anchor text
  - 1 question from the paired text and an excerpt for annotating
- Includes an integrate lesson to make connections across the week's learning
