While reading informational texts, students will demonstrate their understanding by asking questions about key details and integrating ideas across texts. They will engage in collaborative discussions and incorporate their ideas in writing. Students will participate in phonics activities focusing on short and long vowel sounds and two letter blends. Over the course of the unit, students will develop narrative texts working through the various stages of the writing process. During the unit, students will write opinion pieces demonstrating effective organization and supplying reasons to support a point of view.
